OPERATIONS

The 114 Combat Support Squadron originated 1 August 1964, under the command of LtCol Fred A Breesee. The structure of the CSS consisted of Personnel, Training, Administration, Food Service, Motor Pool, Civil Engineers, Operations and Security Police.

Following retirement of LtCol Breesee in May 1970, LtCol Robert E Jamison assumed

command until July 1972, when LtCol Harry A Tunge became commander. When LtCol Tunge transferred to Headquarters, LtCol Edwin G Lambertz was appointed commander. Also serving as commanders in the CSS were LtCol Donald A Edmundson and LtCol Arthur F Schaefer. In July 1987 the Quad Deputy System was implemented and the 114 CSS was replaced/re-designated the 114 Mission Support Squadron. LtCol Schaefer was reassigned as Deputy Commander for Support and LtCol Edward P Kunkel was appointed Commander. After LtCol Kunkel transferred to Headquarters in August 1989, LtCol John A Berheim assumed command. In March 1994, MSS was again reorganized and is now the 114 Mission Support Flight under the command of LtCol Gary E Bak. Throughout all the name changes, our mission has remained the same, to provide quality support and services, and to ensure unit members receive the personnel, training, and information management services needed to complete mission and career planning requirements.
