The 127th Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron was called to active duty under the Air Defense Command and assigned to a radar station at Fort Williams off the coast of Maine later that year.

127th Aircraft Control & Warning Squadron

Allotted: 24 May 1946 to ANG

Federalized: 16 September 1951 at

Fort Williams, Maine

Equipment: TPS-1B 1951;

Released from active duty: 1 September, 1953 and returned to control of Michigan

127th AC&W Squadron: federalized in the ANG on 16 Sep 51 at Ft. Williams, ME, as the 32nd Air Division; transferred to 4711th Defense Wing on 16 Feb 53; released from 24 months active duty and returned to control of the State of Michigan on 1 Sep 53.

The 127th Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron was called to active duty under the Air Defense Command and assigned to a radar station at Fort Williams off the coast of Maine later that year. The 197th Fighter Squadron of the Arizona ANG, which had been stationed at Luke, was also activated and assigned to the 127th Wing.
