## EMBLEM

On a disc per pale Sable and Or, a point in base Azure, in dexter a mountain Tenné garnished Spicebrown, highlighted Argent, in sinister an American bald eagle stooping Proper; palewise throughout a sword erect, blade White hilted of the fourth detailed of the fifth, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and

inscribed "THAT OTHERS MAY LIVE" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "130TH RESCUE SQUADRON" in Black letters.

### **EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE**

Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle symbolizes the Squadron's bravery, speed and agility in responding to military and civilian emergencies. The mountains signify the unit's capability to provide rescue services anywhere. The sword represents support for the unit's commander.
