While the present 137th Mission Support Flight is basically a personnel function, it must be noted that until the late 1960's, each squadron on base performed their own personnel duties. It was about this time when the Consolidated Base Personnel Office (CBPO) concept came into being.

The 137th Mission Support Flights consists of 3 officers and 32 enlisted personnel. In addition, the Family Support function has become a major part of our operation with 3 or 4 full time volunteers and several more on a part-time basis.

The Mission Support Flight probably serves nearly half of the some 1200 guardsmen on any UTA weekend; this would include ID cards, records check/update, training records, reenlistments, promotions/awards/decorations, G.I Bill, student loans, family support, and they have 4 recruiters doing an outstanding job. Helping customers and making them feel welcome is Mission Support's primary goal.

While Mission Support did not actively deploy during Operation Desert Storm, they processed some 200-300 personnel who did deploy. Furthermore, the Family Support group became actively involved assisting family members left behind.

During 20 May - 3 Jun, 1995 the 137th MSF deployed 28 personnel to McChord Air Force Base, WA for two weeks of annual training. This training provided an opportunity to learn more about the active duty personnel
