OPERATIONS

The 141st Communications Flight (Support) was formed and Federally recognized on 1 July 1976. At that time the 141 CFS was assigned 11 enlisted personnel and one officer. Present authorized strength is 26 enlisted personnel and 1 officer.

The mission of the 141 CFS is to provide trained and qualified Communications- Electronics personnel to perform both a Collocated Operating Base (COB) mission and a Combat Crew Communications/Strategic Aircraft Reconstitution Team (CCC/SART) capability in support of the SAC mission. The COB Mission consist of operating a pre-deployed Communications Center in Support of a Fighter Unit in Europe. In addition the 141 CFS is tasked to provide and

support communications capabilities for the 141st Air Refueling Wing day to day mission.

The Comm Flt's ability to meet these mission requirements is demonstrated by being selected two years in a row (1980-1981) for the Adjutant General's Trophy for the Outstanding Air Refueling Unit for the State of Washington and for Air Force Communications Command's Unit Achievement Award for 1982. On 1 December 1983 the 141 CFS was notified that it had been awarded the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award by the Secretary of the Air Force for 1983.
