EMBLEM

On a disc Gules, within an annulet Or, a hurt charged with a pillar Argent (Silver Gray), its capital a mullet of the second, flanked by two lightning flashes chevronwise, points down of

the like, all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "147TH OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The annulet signifies the perpetual sun and reminds Airmen of the integrity required for every mission. The inner border represents the courage and sacrifice of unit members in the face of lethal force. The star is symbolic of Texas, "The Lone Star State." The San Jacinto Monument is symbolic of the founding of Texas and the strength and dedication to defend its principles. The lightning flashes are symbolic of the power to persevere in any situation. The border and scroll itself represent oil and cotton, the chief mineral and agricultural assets of the State of Texas which this unit protects.
