In September 1995, the ANG assumed the airport tower control from the Federal Aviation Agency as part of the on-going establishment of the 270 ATCS. Activation ceremonies on 7 March 1998 celebrated Federal Recognition of the new 49-member 270 ATCS unit, although the actual recognition as a unit came on 1 October 1997. On 10 December 1999, dedication ceremonies officially opened the new Klamath Falls Airport Air Traffic Control Tower. In addition to operating the tower and training air traffic controllers, the new squadron provides a radar approach control at the base.
