## **EMBLEM**

The 302d Logistics Readiness Squadron emblem consists one distinctive element that symbolizes the unique characteristics of the squadron. The emblem consists of an Air Force Yellow rhinoceros in a charging pose set against an ultramarine background. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The ultramarine field represents the appearance of the sky in the early morning and just after dusk. It is symbolic of the around-the-clock work needed to keep the Air Force flying. The rhinoceros illustrates the size and strength of the 302d Logistics Readiness Squadron and the squadron's ability to adapt to any austere condition and operate globally. The color Air Force Yellow indicates the sense of loyalty, duty, and resolve one must have to be a steely-eyed logistician within the squadron. Like rhinos in the wild, logistics can be unpredictable, and the squadron has the capability to turn and charge with great agility and ferociousness when the mission changes. The skin of the rhino, in legend, is unable to be pierced by sword or lance and signifies the responsibility the 302d Logistics Readiness Squadron has for the care and protection of its Airmen. The horns atop the head of the rhinoceros exemplifies the RELENTLESS pursuit of excellence in everything the squadron does.
