EMBLEM



Per bend embattled Azure and Argent (Silver Gray), a stylized bull affronté charging Gules detailed Sable, eyed Argent, in chief a stylized dogwood leaf Or; all within a narrow Blue border. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "307TH CIVIL ENGINEER SQ" in Blue letters. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "IN UNITATE EST VIRTUS" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red bull highlights the unit's activation through the incorporation of the 307th Prime Beef and 307th Red Horse Squadrons. Its red color represents military power and energy. The embattled bend behind the bull points to the unit's role as an engineer squadron and emphasizes their defensive capabilities. The yellow dogwood leaf portrays the unit's allegiance to the 307th Bomb Wing. The motto translates to "IN UNITY THERE IS STRENGTH." (Approved, 14 Sep 2021)
