EMBLEM



Group will use the wing emblem with the group designation in the scroll

Azure, a four-petaled dogwood bloom slipped Or; all within a diminished bordure Or. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "307 MISSION SUPPORT GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The four-petaled dogwood stands for the four combat squadrons of the Wing, with the stem representing the headquarters binding the four squadrons together. (Approved, 4 Mar 2022)
