EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a lightning flash issuing from sinister chief to dexter base Or, overall an American bald eagle volant Proper, grasping in both claws a globe per bend sinister Argent and Sable, grid lines counterchanged, all within a narrow bordure Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "DATUM PERFICIEMUS MUNUS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "313 EOSS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lightning flash represents power. The eagle represents strength, courage and the Squadron's air prowess. The globe represents the Squadron's global reach and worldliness. (Approved, 30 Sep 2010)
