## EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a cross couped Gules, charged with a barrulet dancetty irregular (as a heart monitor line) throughout Sable, surmounted by a caduceus Or detailed of the third highlighted Argent serpents, langued of the third, eyes Red, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "314TH MEDICAL

OPERATIONS SQ" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "THE PULSE" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The cross, a traditional medical symbol, is charged with a line resembling a heart pulse monitor and reflects the unit's mission to give medical attention to those in need. The caduceus symbolizes the expertise of the unit's personnel in providing quality medical care.
