#### EMBLEM

On a grotto blue globe with grid lines and narrow border Air Force yellow, an Air Force blue stylized aircraft between two red stylized missiles with red trails all ascending bendwise.

**SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The emblem as a whole represents the world, the blue background alludes to the sky which is the medium of operation. The stylized missiles represent weapons just have been released by the mother ship which is depicted by the stylized aircraft. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, golden yellow and ultramarine blue. (Approved, 16 Jul 1964)
