Initiated on 21 January 1922 with headquarters at the Municipal Airport, Chicago, IL. Inactivated 22 June 1929 at Chicago by relief of personnel. Reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, 319th Attack Group on 1 October 1933. Conducted summer training most years with units of the 1st Pursuit Group at Chanute Field, IL.
