EMBLEM



Azure, an eagle volant Proper between issuant from base a demi-globe Celeste gridlined Argent and three flight symbols ascending bendwise sinister in chevron formation Or each issuing a radiating contrail bendwise sinister to dexter base of the like; all within a diminished bordure of the last Attached above the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "SUPPORTING EXCELLENCE " in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The soaring eagle symbolizes the unit's commitment to excellence and devotion to duty. The globe represents support to the worldwide Air Force mission. The flight symbols denote the squadron's support to the Wing, (Approved, 26 Jan 1996)
