MISSION

Directs logistics for Western Pacific airlift hub. Orchestrates mobilization of wing and tenant units supporting Pacific Command's operations plans. Oversees one of two Pacific Air Forces combat mobility elements. Maintains Pacific Air Forces fuels mobility equipment. Stores over 13 million and issues over 36 million gallons of fuel. Maintains and operates 1,123 vehicles worth \$75 million. Manages 26,000 critical supplies and equipment. Processes 57,000 passengers, personal property and cargo shipments.
