### EMBLEM



460<sup>th</sup> Medical Group emblem: Azure, in chief a winged eye Proper, wings extended fesswise Argent, the eye emitting six rays throughout Or, three in pile to chief and three in pile reversed surmounted in base by a demi-globe Celeste, gridlined Sable, encircled by two elliptical orbits in saltire of the second, each surmounted at dexter and sinister apex by a Pole Star of four points Yellow garnished Gold Brown, all within a diminished bordure of the third. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "460TH MEDICAL GROUP" in Blue letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The winged eye reflects the unit's heritage. The two orbiting Pole Stars depict the Active Duty and Reserve Components supporting the Wing. The globe symbolizes the global nature of the Wing's mission.

460<sup>th</sup> Medical Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, in front of a demi-sphere in base Celeste, gridlined Sable, a cross coupé Gules, charged with the Staff of Aesculapius of the third, serpent Vert, eyed Black, in chief five mullets in chevron Or, all within a narrow bordure Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MILE HIGH MEDICS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "460TH MEDICAL SQ" in Yellow letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Staff of Aesculapius represents the medical profession. The five stars symbolize the strength and resolve of the Squadron to support the four military components (Army, Navy, Marines and Air Force) and the United States by providing healthcare services. The globe signifies the entire earth and the global range of the wing's mission.
