EMBLEM



635 Combat Support Group emblems



635 Supply Chain Operations Wing emblem: Per pale Medium Blue and Sable, a boomerang Gules, above the Zodiac symbol, Taurus Or, all within a diminished bordure of the like. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "635TH SUPPLY CHAIN OPERATIONS WING" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Zodiac symbol, 'Taurus,' is below the boomerang figure representing an aircraft. This symbolizes that supply chain operations is a supporting foundation of airpower. The divided shield represents day and night. The emblem represents continuous and global supply chain command and control. (Approved, 10 Jul 2008)

Provided host support and retrograde equipment during closure of U-Tapao

The Air Force, in partnership with the Defense Logistics Agency, completed the conversion of 130 stateside installations from JP-8 fuel to Jet A fuel, which is more common and commercially available, according to a release. Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, on Oct. 29 became the last stateside base to undergo the transition. "The fuel conversion at Wright-Patterson marks the end of a journey and the beginning of a new era of financial stewardship for the Air Force fuels community," said Col. Linda Hurry, commander of the 635th Supply Chain Operations Wing at Scott AFB, Ill. Air Force officials began the changeover in 2009 and finished it some 18 months ahead of the estimated 2016 completion date. JP-8 fuel required segregated handling and transportation, and over the past decade, refineries were becoming hesitant to produce it, said Col. Carmen Goyette, Air Force Petroleum Agency commander.
