## EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a winged cross Gules, wings Argent, charged with a caduceus of the second, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "651 EAES" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The cross represents the professionalism of medical services provided to each individual

patient. The caduceus represents the medical skills each person has obtained and trained to perform this mission. The wings represent the air evacuation of patients and relocating them to a higher echelon of medical care.
