EMBLEM



Azure, a flight symbol ascending palewise Argent (Silver Gray) surmounted by a torch Gold Brown base of the second and flammant Proper, in chief a vol Silver Gray; all within a diminished bordure Or. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The wings reflect the Air Force mission. The flight symbol represents the unit's function to support the parent organization by providing qualified personnel. The torch symbolizes the squadron personnel and their ability to impart knowledge. (Approved, 11 Jul 1996)
