EMBLEM

Azure, a globe Celeste, land masses of the field, encircled by two orbitals crossing in dexter charged in sinister chief with a satellite and in sinister base a delta Or, fimbriated Spicebrown, the globe anchored by chain links in saltire Gris, all within a diminished bordure Or. Below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "748TH SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe represents the enterprise wide logistics support provided to Air Forces, both foreign and domestic. The four connecting chains represent four interlinked squadrons (Space and C31, Aircraft, Commodities and Materiel) of the supply chain providing worldwide support at every corner of the globe. Unit Mission: The men and women of the 748th Combat Sustainment Group provide premier engine support all around the world to every branch of the military and to many U.S. allies. The 748th CBSG takes responsibility and great pride in ensuring core program, financial, contract and supply chain management support reaches all users. The group carries out daily management operations to include acquisition, logistics, repair, storage, distribution, disposal and the technical and engineering services necessary to ensure their engines and components meet customer requirements.

What the unit is composed of: The 748th CBSG consists of 14 military, 328 civilians and 26 contractors.

What the unit manages: The 748th CBSG manages a total of 2,943 components and 21,934 engines in support of 24 weapon systems and 10 commands across 40 nations. The group supports several different engine types to including F101, F107, F112, F108, F110, F118, T56, TF34, TF39, J85, J69, J79 and helicopter engines.

Annual operating budget: \$695 million

Impact to the warfighter: The group's 21,934 engines support 24 different weapon systems; many of which take their turn deploying. All of the group's engines deploy on aircraft supporting missions around the world and in every branch of the military.
