On a disc, a representation of an American National Flag fluted to sinister Proper, overall the head of a bulldog couped Argent, detailed Sable, collared Or, studded of the first grasping in its mouth a wrench fesswise arched to chief Proper (Silver Gray), all within a narrow Black border. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "910TH AIRCRAFT MAINT SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The determined bulldog displays the tenacity of unit personnel in performance of their primary duties. The wrench represents the aircraft maintenance mission. The American Flag reflects the patriotism of unit personnel. (Approved, 5 Mar 2004)
