EMBLEM



911 Materiel Squadron emblem: On an Air Force blue disc bordered white, a pelican feeding (red food bits highlighted white) its young, all Air Force yellow detailed gold brown, in a brown nest. Below the disc a white scroll bordered Air Force blue. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is representative of the squadron and the support it renders. The pelican and nest (referred to in heraldry as a pelican and its piety) symbolize the element of selfless service to others and devotion to duty. The emblem bears the Air Force colors ultramarine blue and golden yellow. (Approved, 23 Mar 1964)
