EMBLEM



On a disc per fess Azure and Sable, in base two pales Argent each bearing two arrows erect, the outer arrows higher, in chief a falcon volant of the third garnished Argent (Silver Gray), all within a diminished bordure Or. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll, edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "913 OSS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The black and white stripes represent the Invasion Stripes of the supported airlift squadron during World War II, binding the support squadron with the airlift squadron of past, present and future. The falcon in chief indicates the group's flying capability and the Squadron's support to that ability. The arrows symbolize the force delivered by the supported unit to repel aggression.
