EMBLEM

The bull is a traditional Air Force Civil Engineer symbol representing "Prime BEEF" (Prime Base Engineer Emergency Forces) as the basic description for all civil engineer career fields. The wings are the traditional Air Force symbol and represent the heritage from the US Army Air Forces to today's global reach of Air Force Civil Engineers. The ray of light is derived from the AFSOC patch and is emblematic of the unit's "commando engineer" heritage in the support of the Air Force and Department of Defense special operations mission worldwide. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors and are required to be used. Ultramarine blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. AF Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. Black or silver gray background supports the squadron's unique role in special operations, which are often conducted under the cover of night and of a covert nature. White is the traditional color of the PRIME BEEF bull's horns. Scarlet red represents the fire and rescue flight within the Civil Engineer Squadron.
