EMBLEM



920 Maintenance Squadron emblem: A bi-parted disc is filled with a field of ultramarine blue on the dexter side and a field of sable on sinister. An or lightning bolt issuants from sinister chief to dexter base. A silver gray wrench is positioned salterwise over the lightning bolt at the nombril point. A uplifted sword with a gules hilt is positioned at the base of the disc and is surmounted overall. The disc is bordered with sable. An Air Force or scroll is attached above and below the disc. The scrolls are also bordered with sable. The scroll above bears the unit's designation, "920th Maintenance Squadron." The one below is inscribed with the unit's motto "Excellence In all We Do." **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are used in the design. Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow signifies the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem is symbolic of the unit and its mission. An uplifted sword, centered dominant to the design, symbolizes strength, leadership wisdom and character. The wrench represents the function of maintenance and professionalism of unit personnel. The lightning bolt illustrates the speed at which the unit responds to a worldwide mission. The round disc alludes to the earth and the scope of the unit's universal responsibility. All elements of the unit's emblem reflect the unit's

motto and vision, "Excellence In All We Do." (Approved, 14 Jan 1999)
