### OPERATIONS

RCAF Station Gander Newfoundland was home to 226 AC&W Squadron. Although this was a Canadian unit, it nevertheless fell under control from the NEAC's 64th Air Division (Defense). The unit (N-25) was an Early Warning and GCI facility, and became operational the fall of 1953. St. Anthony, Newfoundland

Another EW/GCI station (N-26) was at St. Anthony, Newfoundland. Personnel of the 921st AC&W Squadron were assigned to the 64th Air Division (Defense) on 1 October 1953. The following month the squadron began operations.

921<sup>st</sup>: activated 26 May 53 at Grenier AFB, NH, as the 4707th Defense Wing; transfer to NEAC in fall of 53; reassigned to ADC and 4731st Air Defense Group on 1 Apr 57; transferred to Goose ADS on 6 Jun 60; transferred to 37th Air Division on 1 Apr 66; discontinued do 18 Jun 68.
