EMBLEM

An ultramarine azure circle is centered on a gules disc. A purpure lambda is positioned at the nombril point and is the focal point of the design. An or greek helmet with a gules plume is positioned at dexter. An or upright sword is placed at sinister. The disc is bordered with sable. Two argent scrolls are attached above and below the disc. The swords are also bordered with sable. The scroll above is blank and is reserved for the unit's designation. The one below is lettered with sable and bears the unit's motto "freedom always." **significance:** ultramarine blue and air force yellow are used in the design. Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of air force operations. Yellow symbolizes the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The helmet and sword represent the sun, justice and loyalty. The red plume and disc symbolize the qualities of boldness, courage patriotism strength and valor. Jurisdiction, power and sacrifice are referenced by the purple lambda, while the gray scroll background alludes to discretion and maturity exhibited by security personnel. The black scroll lettering and emblem highlights portray determination and perseverance. (approved, 30 jan 1990)
