EMBLEM



An argent stylized aircraft followed by three or contrails is positioned at dexter chief. Three gules arrows emanate from the base of the disc and travel to the sinister, dexter and fess point positions. An or winged caduceus is surmounted over the arrows at the nombril point. The disc is bordered with or. An ultramarine azure scroll is attached above and below the disc. The scrolls are bordered also with or. The scroll above is blank. The one below is lettered with or and bears the unit's motto: "caring above and beyond." **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and air force yellow are used in the design. Blue represents the sky, the primary theater of air force operations. Yellow signifies the sun and the excellence required of air force personnel. The emblem is symbolic of the unit and its mission. The stylized aircraft emitting three contrails represent the flying mission of the unit and the contributions of the medical and support personnel assigned. The three red arrows, symbolizing courage and sacrifice of its members, also reflect the scope of the mission, east, west and ' locally. The winged caduceus depicts the unit's mission as a medical response force. All elements reflect the unit's motto: "caring above and beyond." (Approved, 26 Mar 1996)
