EMBLEM



Celeste, an ellipsoid Argent, grid lined and rimmed Sable, and charged with a polestar of the second, shaded Gules, outlined of the third, in chief a stylized aircraft fesswise White, emitting six vapor trails Or, all within a diminished bordure of the sixth. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "932D MISSION SUPPORT GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The aircraft above the globe represents the Group's airlift mission. The globe denotes the unit's ability to deliver its mission worldwide at any time. The compass star suggests the Group's functions within a local community as well as providing support to the nation's defense of peace throughout the world. The star also stands for the citizen airman Reservists and their commitment to serve. (Approved, 24 May 2018)
