EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, an eagle displayed with two heads Tenné (Golden Orange), its heads and tail feathers Argent detailed Argent (Silver gray), beak and talons Or, claws of the second, grasping in dexter talon an olive branch and in sinister talon a sheaf of arrows, points upward and to sinister, all of the third, garnished of the fourth, superimposed on its body five mullets in chevron reversed White, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "VICTIS HONOR" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "932D OPERATIONS SUPPORT FLIGHT" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The double-headed golden orange bald eagle is symbolic of war and peace, facing in opposite directions while holding both arrows and an olive branch. The eagle further exemplifies the Flight's dedication to White House, Congressional delegations, Air Force Reserve Command and Air Force Special Air Mission operations. This relates to the unit's mission of supporting key leaders as they travel to promote democracy and diplomacy with other pertinent members of foreign nations. The white olive branch in the left talon symbolizes the decision making process to prefer peace over war. The three white arrows in the right talon signify power, diplomacy and the ability to still wage war. The five stars chevronwise over the eagle represent the five branches of the U.S. Armed Forces.
