On a disc Celeste, in fess a devil volant, trident tailed Gules, hair, beard and detailed Sable winged with flames Proper, dexter hand raised and holding a missile bendwise sinister Silver Gray with contrail flamant, in sinister hand a wrench bendwise of the last, all above a cloud Proper shaded to base Or, all within a narrow border Red. Attached below the disc an Ultramarine Blue scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "944TH AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE SQ" in Red letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The winged devil with trident tail is symbolic of the historical lineage of the 302d Fighter Squadron "Hellions". The mechanic's wrench is representative of the unit's ability to meet the readiness of national defense needs and AEF tasking. The missile is symbolic of the ability of the unit to be combat ready, strike anywhere and anytime, to ensure freedom and liberty. The cloud with reflective surface alludes to the magnificent Arizona setting sun. (Approved, 22 Nov 2004)
