### EMBLEM





Azure, a devil at stride traversed in trian aspect Gules horned Gray belching flames from his mouth Proper and fumant from its ears two clouds Argent garnished of the first, grasping in his sinister hand a wrench palewise of the third and in his dexter hand a trident in bend, points to base arraswise Sable garnished of the third, all within a narrow bordure Red. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed 944th MAINTENANCE SQ in Red letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red devil suggests the historical link between the unit and the 302d Fighter Squadron's color emblem bearing a Red Devil. The three prongs of the trident symbolize bold, swift, eager support to its parent unit. The wrench reflects the maintenance function the squadron provides. (Approved, 17 Mar 2000)
