It is a timely, accurate information resource, providing a "you-are-there" perspective, and is essential battlefield information in support of strategic, operational, and tactical mission objectives. Combat camera personnel are an integral part of Joint exercises, contingency operations, humanitarian relief efforts, and disasters of every kind. The squadron consists of technical experts in Visual Information career fields Still Photography and Videography and dedicated support professionals. 1st Combat Camera Squadron imagery is also archived for historical purposes and can be recalled through the Joint Combat Camera Center at the Pentagon and the Defense Visual Information Center at Riverside, CA. COMCAM does not include imagery specifically acquired by Intelligence activities.
