OPERATIONS

The 1st Experimental Guided Missile Group was activated at Eglin Field, Florida on 6 Feb 1946. The group consisted of the 1st Experimental Guided Missiles Squadron and the 1st Experimental Air Service Squadron. The primary duty of the squadron was the launching and testing of the JB-2 Loon, the U.S. version of the German V-1.

The 1st Experimental Guided Missiles Squadron of the 1st Experimental Guided Missile Group moved to Patrick AFB in early December, 1950. On December 30th, the unit was inactivated and all personnel were reassigned to the new 1st Guided Missile Squadron, part of the new 4800th Guided Missile Wing as the 550th Guided Missile Wing was inactivated.
