### **EMBLEM**

On a disc Argent, per fess enhanced to bend Azure and Celeste, between in chief three mullets, one and two of the first, and in base an olive branch to dexter Vert, fimbriated of the second, a lightning bolt of two points palewise Gules, fimbriation counterchanged of the second and of the third, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "COMPLIANT LETHAL READY" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "3D MUNITIONS SQUADRON" in Blue letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The divided background of light and dark represents the unit's twenty-four hour operations. The stars depict the unit's numerical designation. The lightning bolt represents the lethal devices with which the Squadron works. The

olive branch symbolizes peace, the ultimate goal. The motto, “COMPLIANT LETHAL READY,” indicates the unit’s willingness and preparedness to flawlessly execute the assigned mission. (Approved, 11 Mar 1959)
