EMBLEM

The emblem's yellow and blue are traditional to Air Force heraldry. The blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and the yellow is symbolic of the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lightning bolts and satellite represent communications, while the aircraft represents the squadron's combat and reconnaissance support missions. The computer terminal alludes to the technical aspects of the mission, and the yin/yang background design symbolizes the squadron's support of units in Korea and the entire Western Pacific.
