The 27 Special Operations Medical Support Squadron promotes and maintains health of all active duty, Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve personnel, dependents and retirees in the local area. Personnel provide disaster preparedness, Tricare, patient administration, readiness, information systems, resources, and pharmacy, laboratory and logistics services.

EMBLEM



Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The divided disc reflects the unit's team effort to support Air Force personnel with good medical care. The red cross denotes the unit as a medical squadron. The eagle symbolizes the unit's ability to seek out methods of preventative medicine and to provide swift medical care when the needs arise.
