EMBLEM

On a maroon equilateral triangle one point down, edged Air Force golden yellow, above a red

bomb dropping to base, fins and highlight white, in dexter chief an atomic symbol of three orbits white voided Air Force nucleus red, and in sinister (left) an Air Force golden yellow lightning bolt bendwise pointing to honor point; outline and details Air Force blue throughout.

Approved 26 May 1960

EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE

The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The background of maroon edged with gold displays the squadron's colors. The atom structure represents the technical aspect of munitions the bolt of lightning indicates the energy potential and the bomb is a symbol of all munitions functions. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow and the national colors; red, white and blue.
