## **EMBLEM**

The blue background alludes to the Air Force's theater of operation. The globe represents the unit's major command, Air Force Communications Command, and its global communications mission. The winged torch represents education and knowledge, a primary mission of Goodfellow Air Force Base, the home of the unit. The arrow indicates the four branches of the Armed Forces that the unit supports. The stars represent the branches of the unit—administrative, maintenance, and operations. The lightning bolts signify that the unit's communications mission is worldwide—that is the "four corners" of the globe.
