The Western Range is represented by an instrumentation dish with associated electromagnetic energy and waves. The Air Force yellow represents “the sun” and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The WR sphere of operation is represented by three bands of color, the green representing land, ultramarine/reflex blue representing both ocean and sky, with the sky being the primary theater of Air Force operations, and black representing space.
