On a disc Murrey, a bull's head couped at the neck in tran-aspect reversed Or, armed and shaded of the field, eyed Azure, in chief three flight symbols ascending bendwise in chevron Argent, in base two lightning flashes in chevron reversed Yellow, all within a double narrow border White and Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "VEREOR TAURUS" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "31ST STUDENT SQUADRON" in Black letters. **SIGIFICANCE: SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The bull represents the Squadron's strength and power. The three flight symbols allude to the Air Force Core Values: Integrity, Service Before Self, and Excellence In All We Do. The lightning bolts denote leadership and teamwork, the foundation concepts upon which all success at the Squadron Officer School is built. (Approved, 6 Nov 2003)
