EMBLEM



35 Medical Service Squadron emblem: On a medium blue disc edged with an entwined yellow rope border outlined and detailed blue a red caduceus detailed maroon. Attached above the disc a white scroll edged blue and inscribed "SERVING OUR MILITARY FORCES" in blue letters. Attached below the disc a blank white scroll edged blue. (Approved, 15 Jan 1991)

35 Medical Service Squadron emblem: On an ultramarine azure disc. An argent globe emerges from sinister base and occupies all points except chief dexter chief and dexter. Five or estoilles, three extending from chief to dexter chief and two positioned at dexter, occupy these points. Or longitude and latitude lines highlight the globe. An argent Wright brothers era aircraft is surmounted over the globe at the honor point. An or Caduceus surmounted on a Geneva gules cross is positioned between base and sinister base and extends to the honor point. The disc is bordered with or. Two argent scrolls are attached above and below the disc. The scrolls are also bordered with or. The scroll below is blank, the one above is lettered with sable and bears the unit's motto "in time of need. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are used in the design. Blue represents the sky the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow signifies the sun and the excellence required of air force personnel. The white background of the globe and scrolls alludes to qualities of purity and wisdom displayed by all assigned members. The red of the cross refers to the blood and life and courage of the soldiers, sailors, and airmen who fell in support of the mission. The faith in personnel in their mission is reflected in the silver aircraft. The black in the design indicates strength and dedication of all unit personnel.
