EMBLEM

On a red disc a shield fimbriated light blue divided by a white bend sinister black, red, and yellow in chief bend sinisterwise and blue in base bearing thirteen white stars all within a narrow blue border. Attached above the disc a yellow scroll bordered blue and attached below the disc a yellow scroll bordered blue inscribed "SERVING THOSE WHO SERVE" in blue letters. **SIGIFICANCE** The mission of the 36th Services Squadron is to serve. The motto as indicated on the proposed emblem is "Serving Those Who Serve." The unit is assigned to the 36th Combat Support Group which falls under the 36th Tactical Fighter Wing, Bitburg Air Base, Germany. The red, yellow, and black stripes on the proposed emblem are the colors of the Federal Republic of Germany's flag. This denotes the 36th Services Squadron is in Germany and carries out its mission each day with the devoted help of numerous German National employees. The thirteen stars on blue background denotes American Forces. These combined represent Americans and Germans serving together in harmony. (Approved, 29 Sep 1983)
