EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, in front of a torch Or flamant Gules, a beam balance scale Silver Gray detailed Smoke, surmounted in base by a feather quill pen bendwise White detailed Silver Gray, all within a diminished border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MISSIO CUSTOS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "37TH CONTRACTING SQ" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The scale reflects the unit's efforts to ensure standards of equity and fairness in drafting and awarding contracts. The quill symbolizes the integrity of Squadron personnel. The Torch of Knowledge represents continuous training needed by unit personnel to stay current with all necessary information pertinent to mission functions.

Azure, a torch Or flamant Gules debruised by a scale Gray surmounted in base by a quill bendwise Argent; all within a diminished bordure of the second. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border. Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The scale reflects the unit's efforts to ensure standards of equity and fairness in drafting and awarding contracts.
