The insignia most commonly used on the sides of the aircraft was the familiar "Fried Egg" badge of the 37 Division consisting of a center solid red circle outlined white circle.

The official badge of the 37th Division Aviation, approved 16 May 1929, was on a pentagon, one point up, divided per chevron reversed or and azure. The crest for the NG of Ohio proper.
