EMBLEM



On a blue disc, a yellow globe grid lined blue surmounted in dexter chief by a silver gray silhouette of a human and in sinister chief by a silver gray pallet with crates and in base by a silver gray forklift; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached below the disc a blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The silhouetted figure represents a passenger and reflects the air passenger service of the unit. The pallet and forklift symbolize the air cargo mission of the Squadron. (Approved, 30 Jun 1988)
