EMBLEM



On a blue disc, a green sphere gridlined black surmounted by a yellow cap and bearing a stylized white and black aircraft, all between two stalks of wheat and above three arrows all yellow, all within a narrow yellow border, Attached above the disc a blue scroll bordered yellow inscribed "ACTION PRIDE SERVICE" in yellow letters and attached below the disc a blue scroll bordered yellow, **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The air transport over the green globe represents the mission of the 49th Aerial Port Squadron to support the Military Airlift Command's global airlift mission. The wheat syllabizes the unit's support of peacetime humanitarian missions and tile arrows signify the combat readiness of the Squadron.
