Resource management became a critical issue in the mid 1970s. Perhaps as a backlash from antimilitary feelings during the era, the budget of the armed forces was dramatically reduced. Sheppard was preoccupied with drives to conserve energy and paper, as the Air Force rode out the difficult days of the Arab oil embargo and the mild recession. Sheppard experimented with solar heating for its Bunker Hill

housing units, which had been built in 1975-76 on the site of the former hospital. In recognition of the new era, the 3750th Maintenance and Supply Group was redesignated the 3750th Resource Management Group. Personnel were actively counselled to eliminate fraud, waste or abuse of government resources.
