EMBLEM

Celeste, a demi-eagle displayed Or, head Argent charged with an escutcheon of the last bearing a cross couped Gules between a caduceus in base, snakes Azure, rod Yellow, and in chief an arc of nine mullets White; all within a diminished bordure Sable. Attached above the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "CHAMPIONS FOR EXCELLENCE" in Black letters. Attached below the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "6TH MEDICAL SUPPORT SQ." **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle bearing a universal health care symbol, denotes the unit's support to its parent organization. The caduceus symbolizes the specific support and reflects the training of the unit personnel. The stars denote the flights that are assigned to the squadron. (Approved, 22 May 1996)
